

Judd Semingson new CHCA chair

LITTLE ROCK – **Judd Semingson**, CEO of Community Clinic based in Springdale, has been elected to lead the Board for the largest primary care network in the state.

Semingson, 45, was chosen Board chair in a unanimous vote during the Community Health Centers of Arkansas (CHCA) Board meeting in June. His term begins Saturday, **July 1.** He replaces **Brigitte McDonald**, CEO of 1st Choice Healthcare in Corning. Her term ends Friday, **June 30.**

"Community Health Centers across the state and the nation share a common and essential mission of expanding access to quality health care for all," Semingson said. "I love what we do, and I am proud to help lead these incredible organizations in Arkansas."

Semingson holds an MBA in Healthcare Administration and is a practicing APRN in addition to his CEO responsibilities. Community Clinic's expanding operations in northwest Arkansas include **18 locations** serving more than **42,000 patients** a year.

As Board chair, Semingson will provide guidance for CHCA and its **11 Community Health Center (CHC) organization members** throughout the state. He previously served as vice chair.

CHCs in Arkansas serve more than **285,000 people** each year at more than **200 locations**.
